

Notes from Willie Edwards Petty:

Notes typed exactly as written

- Alice met Bud Dobbs while living at Mt. Gilead. he was widower with 3 boys. Bud lived 3 miles from Woodstock. Edwards family moved to Woodstock to live with alic after Bud died of Typhoid Fever.
- The train tracks in Woodstock crossed the road several times. The train would frighten the horses. Old home place was near railroad tracks.
- Lived in two places between Mt. Gilead on Woodstock Rd. in Cherokee County. Annie and Ella are buried at Mt. Gilead Methodist Church. ...married and started house keeping.
- Family moved to Woodstock Cobb County, Aunt Alice Place. Lived there 2 1/2 years. 3 miles to Little River Church (small church)
- Moved to Midway in Forsyth County half way between Cumming and Alpharetta. Lived here 3 years.
- Dalton, Georgia - Moved in 4 wagons and carried furniture. Lived in Dalton 6 months. Aileen worked as milliner. Aunt Alice worked as a seamstress.
- Clio started to school in Dalton, 5 1/2 years old.
- Rest of girls worked in hosiery factory - Ida, Emma, Edna, Willie.
- Moved to Marietta and lived in warehouse off courthouse square on Whitlock Avenue, stayed about three weeks.
- Moved to Lemon and Cherokee Street. Rented house for three months while house was being built.
- Moved to new home on Campbell Hill Street behind Kennestone Hospital. Clio, Willie, Talmage attended school in Marietta. Stayed in Marietta 3 years.

- Moved to Atlanta 308 Whitehall Street - January 1, 1904. Big 9 room frame boarding house and served meals. Willie met Charlie while living here.
- Clio attended Formwalt Street School and Commercial High
- Willie went ot work for Kutz Millinery
- Aileen worked Rhodes Millinery Store on Broad Street.
- Talmadge took a business course in Atlanta while living on Whitehall Street.
- Alice worked for J.M. High Co. and J. Pallens and Company. Stayed on Whitehall 7 years. Grandpa died while living on Whitehall. Aileen killed by auto while departing from street car. Alice was hurt but got alright. Accident at Gordon Street and Holderness.
- Ida worked for J. Pallens
- Move from Whitehall to 217 Holderness Street. Willie got married in 1912 while living at Holderness St. Charlie boarded and roomed with Talmadge.
- Alice and Clio moved to 46 Grady Place. Clio secretary to Walter Rich of Rich's Inc. Alice still working at J Pallens.
- Clio worked for J.E. Hangar, manufacturer of artificial limbs. Stayed on Grady Place till 1925.
- Moved from Grady Place to 859 Cascade. Lived here 44+ years
- Willie and Charlie bought home on Grady Place later sold home to Alice and Clio and moved to Rogers Avenue.
- Emma eloped while living at 308 Whitehall and married Clady Caldwell and they lived on Whitehall Terrace and then Whitehall Street and then to Oak Street.
- Talmage married and stayed on at 217 Holderness - lived in two rooms worked at Empire Printing and Box Co. Met Kat at work at Empire Printing and Box Co., bought house across street, later bought 553 Holderness.

- Wibb and Mitt married while living at Woodstock - he moved to Midway and then to Marietta - Kennesaw at foot of Mountain - all children born in Marietta.
- Laura, Ida and Edna never married. Edna and Ida worked for Jacobs Pharmacy, wrapped packages and answered telephone. Store located where First National Bank stands today - Five Points.
- Ida also worked for Davison Paxon.
- Edna worked for Graybon (Western Electric) as switch board operator until she retired.
- Laura kept house,
- Clio living on Holderness Street when she met Herbert.
- Lucile Arnold introduced Herbert to Clio while Clio was visiting Lucile in Dublin, Georgia.
